“Bridge to Ridge” Prologue ITT

Course: Technical, fast, beautiful, 3.75 miles, 524 ft elevation gain. The Prologue Individual Time Trial will begin at the Granite Gates of Dartmouth College at the base of Tuck Drive, next to the Ledyard Parking Lots beside the Connecticut River. Riders will ascend a stunning single-lane road with forested walls to each side to Tuck Mall, where they will begin a fast and technical route through the heart of Dartmouth's beautiful campus. Rolling terrain follows on Highway 10, and after a right turn at the Roundabout by Garipay Fields, riders will climb Reservoir and Grasse Rd, fighting both dirt and pavement as they finish near the summit of Balch Hill. **WARNING:** Return route to staging area is a high-speed descent with hidden driveways and frequent traffic. **PROCEED WITH CAUTION AND OBEY TRAFFIC SAFETY LAWS.**

Frat Row Criterium

Course: Technical, .75 miles, 4 Corners. The Frat Row Criterium will begin on the false flat of Webster Avenue, home to most of Dartmouth's fraternities. This course will be fast and technical. History has shown us that the time to move to the front for a sprint is not in the middle of Turn #4; you're more likely become more acquainted with the shrubbery of the President's House than the glory of the finish line if you try.

Registration:

*New non-collegiate women racers with 1-day or first time USAC Category 4 licenses may enter Collegiate Women's Intro Category.
*New non-collegiate junior men racers with 1-day or first time USAC Category 5 licenses may enter Collegiate Men's Intro Category.

All other collegiate categories are open only to full time students with valid USAC Collegiate Licenses. USA Cycling Collegiate and General yearly and one-day licenses available for sale on site. Event registration is available online at Bikereg.com. \$5 Late Fee PER RACE for day-of registration. Service surcharges may apply for online registration. The race entry fee is \$15 (\$10 for individual time trial). USAC time trial entry fees will be \$15.

Online registration is available on BIKEREg; note that additional service surcharges may apply. Mail-in registration and payment is available for collegiate teams and must be received by 13 April 2011 (contact promoter Isaiah Berg for more details). Large teams may pre-register by e-mailing Dartmouth.Cycling.Team@Gmail.com a team spreadsheet containing **Racer Name, Racer Age, Category, License #, and Races Participating In**. Pre-registration must be received by 13 April 2011. Day-of race registration opens at 7:00AM and closes 30 minutes before start time for each race.

Directions

Saturday: Hanover Prologue ITT & Frat Row Criterium

Google/Mapquest location: Ledyard Free Bridge, Hanover, NH

From I-91 Northbound: Take exit 13 for Norwich and Hanover, NH. Turn right (east) at the end of the ramp. Cross the Connecticut River and turn left immediately between the two pillars; the gravel parking lot rests beside the Connecticut River immediately to your left. The staging area and start line for the Prologue ITT will be at the base of the road, near the granite pillars of Old Tuck Drive.

From I-91 Southbound: Take exit 13 for Norwich and Hanover, NH. Turn left (east) at the end of the ramp. Follow directions from I-91 Northbound from here.

From I-89 Northbound: After passing Lebanon, NH, look to exit onto I-91 North. Follow directions from I-91 Northbound from here.

From I-89 Southbound: Take the exit for I-91 North (if you reach New Hampshire you've gone too far south). Follow directions from I-91 Northbound from here.

Other Information

PARKING: Parking for the morning prologue time trial is conveniently located next to the start line, in the Ledyard parking lot beside the Connecticut River. Due to shared parking permits with other Dartmouth events, Ledyard parking for the morning ITT may be tight; please follow the instructions of parking marshals and prepare to park "tight" for a couple of hours. Once the time trial event has been completed, we suggest that teams move closer to the Frat Row Criterium by parking at "CRIT PARKING" in the College's Dewey Lot. There are other options on campus, in particular a lot east of the MMRS Medical Station but we would encourage teams to simply stage from Dewey Lot.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES: For the Frat Row Criterium the New Hampshire Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) Task Force will be providing a mobile hospital immediately to the west of Parking Lot #1. Their services will be supplemented by Dartmouth EMS, who will provide two mobile response teams, as well as a first aid station on Webster Avenue.

RESTROOMS: Dartmouth College has kindly offered us their facilities in Rockefeller/Silsby Hall. For the morning time trial, portable restrooms will be available in the Ledyard parking lot.
